Report of Research

Major Research Interests:

- 1) The causes of sudden unexplained death in children (SUDC)
- 2) Bereavement following SUDC
- 3) Best practices for medicolegal death investigations

Description of Research:

SUDC is defined as the sudden and unexpected death of a child greater than 12 months of age in whom a complete autopsy and death scene investigation fail to determine a cause of death. We have described a potential new entity characterized by sudden death in toddlers associated with hippocampal anomalies and individual and/or family history of febrile seizures embedded under the rubric of SUDC. Our group is in the process of determining the genetics, cause, pathogenesis, and intervention strategies of this putative entity.

In cooperation with the National Association of Medical Examiners (NAME), International Association of Coroners and Medical Examiners (IAC&ME), American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators (ABMDI), myself along with Dr Rebecca Rudd, and Lisa Marian LCSW are investigating the current policy and practices within the MDI community in regards to sudden child death as well as the interests and feedback from bereaved families who have experienced the process.
