2 “(2) SUBSEQUENT REPORT.—Not later than 24
3 months after the date of enactment of the Trau-
4 matic Brain Injury Reauthorization Act of 2013, the
5 Secretary, acting through the Director of the Cen-
6 ters for Disease Control and Prevention and the Di-
7 rector of the National Institutes of Health and in
8 consultation with the Secretary of Defense and the
9 Secretary of Veterans Affairs, shall submit to the
10 relevant committees of Congress a report that—

11 “(A) identifies which recommendations in
12 the report under paragraph (1) have been
13 adopted and which recommendations in such re-
14 port have not been adopted; and

15 “(B) includes a description of planned ac-
16 tivities to address each recommendation in such
17 report that has not been adopted.”.

18 (c) FUNDING.—Section 394A of the Public Health
19 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280b–3) is amended—

20 (1) by striking “and” after “1994,”;

21 (2) by striking the second period at the end;

22 and

23 (3) by adding at the end the following: “Of the
24 amounts made available to carry out this part for
25 each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018, there is au-

1 thorized to be appropriated \$6,100,000 to carry out
2 sections 393B and 393C.”.

3 **SEC. 3. STATE GRANTS FOR PROJECTS REGARDING TRAU-**
4 **MATIC BRAIN INJURY.**

5 Section 1252 of the Public Health Service Act (42
6 U.S.C. 300d–52) is amended—

7 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “, acting
8 through the Administrator of the Health Resources
9 and Services Administration,”;

10 (2) in paragraphs (1)(A)(i) and (3)(E) of sub-
11 section (f), by striking “brain injury” and inserting
12 “traumatic brain injury”;

13 (3) in subsection (h), by striking the comma
14 after “under this section” and inserting a comma
15 before “including”; and

16 (4) by amending subsection (j) to read as fol-
17 lows:

18 “(j) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For
19 carrying out this section and section 1253, there is author-
20 ized to be appropriated \$9,760,000 for each of fiscal years
21 2014 through 2018.”.

22 **SEC. 4. STATE GRANTS FOR PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY**
23 **SERVICES.**

24 Section 1253 of the Public Health Service Act (42
25 U.S.C. 300d–53) is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “, acting
2 through the Administrator of the Health Resources
3 and Services Administration (referred to in this sec-
4 tion as the ‘Administrator’),”;

5 (2) in subsections (c), (d)(1), (e)(1), (e)(4), (g),
6 (h), and (j)(1), by striking “Administrator” each
7 place it appears and inserting “Secretary”;

8 (3) in subsection (h)—

9 (A) by striking the subsection heading and
10 inserting “REPORTING”;

11 (B) by striking “Each protection and advo-
12 cacy system” and inserting the following:

13 “(1) REPORTS BY SYSTEMS.—Each protection
14 and advocacy system”; and

15 (C) by adding at the end the following:

16 “(2) REPORT BY SECRETARY.—Not later than
17 1 year after the date of enactment of the Traumatic
18 Brain Injury Reauthorization Act of 2013, the Sec-
19 retary shall prepare and submit to the appropriate
20 committees of Congress a report describing the serv-
21 ices and activities carried out under this section dur-
22 ing the period for which the report is being pre-
23 pared.”.

24 (4) in subsection (i)—

1 (A) by striking “Administrator of the
2 Health Resources and Services Administration”
3 and inserting “Secretary”; and

4 (B) by striking “by the Administrator”
5 and inserting “by the Secretary”;

6 (5) in subsection (k), by striking “subtitle C”
7 and inserting “subtitle C of title I”;

8 (6) by striking subsection (l) (relating to au-
9 thorization of appropriations); and

10 (7) by redesignating subsection (m) as sub-
11 section (l).
