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**A BILL**

To amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to provide for an extension of the enhanced FMAP for certain Medicaid health homes for individuals with substance use disorders.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF ENHANCED FMAP FOR CERTAIN**  
4 **HEALTH HOMES FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH**  
5 **SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS.**

6 Section 1945 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.  
7 1396w-4) is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (c)—

2 (A) in paragraph (1), by inserting “subject  
3 to paragraph (4),” after “except that,”; and

4 (B) by adding at the end the following new  
5 paragraph:

6 “(4) SPECIAL RULE RELATING TO SUBSTANCE  
7 USE DISORDER HEALTH HOMES.—

8 “(A) IN GENERAL.—In the case of a State  
9 with an SUD-focused State plan amendment  
10 (as defined in subparagraph (B)) approved by  
11 the Secretary on or after October 1, 2018, if  
12 the State satisfies the requirement described in  
13 subparagraph (C) with respect to such State  
14 plan amendment, the Secretary may, at the re-  
15 quest of the State, extend the application of the  
16 Federal medical assistance percentage described  
17 in paragraph (1) to payments for the provision  
18 of health home services under such State plan  
19 amendment, in addition to the first 8 fiscal year  
20 quarters the State plan amendment is in effect,  
21 for the subsequent 4 fiscal year quarters that  
22 the State plan amendment is in effect. Nothing  
23 in this section shall be construed as prohibiting  
24 a State with a State plan amendment that is  
25 approved under this section and that is not an

1 SUD-focused State plan amendment from addi-  
2 tionally having approved on or after such date  
3 an SUD-focused State plan amendment under  
4 this section, including for purposes of applica-  
5 tion of this paragraph.

6 “(B) SUD-FOCUSED STATE PLAN AMEND-  
7 MENT.—For purposes of this paragraph, the  
8 term ‘SUD-focused State plan amendment’  
9 means a State plan amendment under this sec-  
10 tion that is designed to provide health home  
11 services primarily to eligible individuals with  
12 chronic conditions who are individuals with sub-  
13 stance use disorders.

14 “(C) OUTCOMES REQUIREMENTS.—For  
15 purposes of subparagraph (A), a State satisfies  
16 the requirement described in this subparagraph,  
17 with respect to an SUD-focused State plan  
18 amendment and eligible individuals with chronic  
19 conditions provided health home services under  
20 such State plan amendment, if the State has  
21 demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Sec-  
22 retary that such State plan amendment has—

23 “(i) improved the quality of health  
24 care provided to such individuals;

1                   “(ii) improved access of such individ-  
2                   uals to health care; and

3                   “(iii)(I) reduced the total expenditures  
4                   of such individuals for health care; or

5                   “(II) provided health home services to  
6                   such individuals with no increase to such  
7                   total expenditures for such individuals.

8                   For purposes of this subparagraph, the  
9                   Secretary shall specify all applicable meas-  
10                  ures for determining quality, access, and  
11                  expenditures and provide guidance on how  
12                  to measure improvement.

13                  “(D) BEST PRACTICES.—Not later than  
14                  October 1, 2020, the Secretary shall make pub-  
15                  licly available on the Internet website of the  
16                  Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services best  
17                  practices for designing and implementing an  
18                  SUD-focused State plan amendment, based on  
19                  the experiences of States that have State plan  
20                  amendments approved under this section that  
21                  include eligible individuals with chronic condi-  
22                  tions who are individuals with substance use  
23                  disorders.”.
