## Lou Kennedy Nephron Pharmaceuticals Corporation President/CEO



Lou Kennedy is **President**, **Chief Executive Officer** and **Owner** of **Nephron Pharmaceuticals Corporation** – a pharmaceutical manufacturer specializing in Blow-Fill-Seal technology, along with an industry-leading 503B Outsourcing Facility. Kennedy joined Nephron Pharmaceuticals in 2001, and accepted the position of President and Chief Executive Officer in September 2007. Having held a variety of marketing and operational roles during her career; one notable achievement at Nephron was **creating a national sales force**, supplying products to all 50 states and Puerto Rico. This helped Nephron Pharmaceuticals **grow by 300%** and increased shipped product to **one billion doses** each year. Kennedy is committed to **innovation**, **quality** and **service**, which have been the core mission areas of her company for **over 20 years**.

Originating in Orlando, Florida, Nephron Pharmaceuticals moved its headquarters to West Columbia, South Carolina in early June 2014. Kennedy was at the forefront of this expansion, building a state-of-the-art manufacturing facility valued over 325 million dollars, and creating over 850 jobs. Under Kennedy's leadership, Nephron received an honorable mention award for **Global Facility of the Year** in 2017 from the **International Society for Pharmaceutical Engineering** (ISPE).

Kennedy is a graduate of the **University of South Carolina** (1984) where she obtained her Bachelor of Arts degree in public relations in less than 4 years. She also became the first-ever recipient of an Honorary Associate Degree in Humane Letters from **Midlands Technical College** (2017), recognizing her service and philanthropy within the community.

Education and community development are two areas where Kennedy is actively involved. Together with her husband Bill, she helped establish the Kennedy Pharmacy Innovation Center (2010) in conjunction with the USC School of Pharmacy. Additionally, the couple funded the Kennedy Greenhouse Studio (2015) at the USC School of Journalism and Mass Communications, as well as the William Jerry Wood Life Skills Center (2014) at Midlands Technical College, preparing students to become valuable in the workplace.

Kennedy serves on a variety of business and civic boards, including but not limited to, SCBIO (South Carolina Biotechnology Industry Organization) as the 2018 and 2019 Board Chair, the South Carolina Chamber of Commerce Chairman in fall 2018, the Synovus South Carolina Bank Board, Palmetto Business Forum, as well as various boards associated with the University of South Carolina.

Kennedy received the Order of the Palmetto from SC Governor Nikki Haley in 2011 (SC's highest civilian honor). She was also named Citizen of the Year by Greater Cayce West Columbia Chamber of Commerce (2016), Lexington County Ambassador for Economic Development by SC Department of Commerce (2014), and Ambassador of the Year by the Greater Columbia Chamber of Commerce (2013). Kennedy is on the list of 50 Most Influential by Columbia Business Monthly. She was a recipient of the Inspiring Women Award from Coastal Carolina University (2017). Kennedy received the first ever Woman of the Year Award from the South Carolina Manufacturers Alliance.
