The International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators (IACLEA) strongly supports the swift and clean passage of H.R. 3539, the Behavioral Intervention Guidelines (BIG) Act of 2019. H.R. 3539 amends the Public Health Service Act by requiring the development of best practices for the establishing and using behavioral intervention teams at schools and institutions of higher education.

Our members are police chiefs, public safety directors, law enforcement officers, and security personnel at higher education institutions across the globe.
