 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Medication Access and
5 Training Expansion Act of 2021" or the "MATE Act of
6 2021".

1	SEC. 2. REQUIRING PRESCRIBERS OF CONTROLLED SUB-
2	STANCES TO COMPLETE TRAINING ON
3	TREATING AND MANAGING PATIENTS WITH
4	OPIOID AND OTHER SUBSTANCE USE DIS-
5	ORDERS.
6	Section 303 of the Controlled Substances Act (21
7	U.S.C. 823) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
8	lowing:
9	"(1) REQUIRED TRAINING FOR PRESCRIBERS ON
10	TREATING AND MANAGING PATIENTS WITH OPIOID AND
11	Other Substance Use Disorders.—
12	"(1) Applicability.—This subsection ap-
13	plies—
14	"(A) with respect to any practitioner who
15	is licensed under State law to prescribe con-
16	trolled substances and is not a veterinarian or
17	a dentist; and
18	"(B) beginning with the first registration
19	or renewal of registration by the practitioner
20	under this section occurring 180 or more days
21	after the date of enactment of the Medication
22	Access and Training Expansion Act of 2021.
23	"(2) TRAINING REQUIRED.—As a condition on
24	registration under this section to dispense controlled
25	substances in schedule II, III, IV, or V, the Attorney

1	General shall require any practitioner described in
2	paragraph (1)(A) to meet the following:
3	"(A) If the practitioner is a physician, the
4	practitioner must meet one or more of the fol-
5	lowing conditions:
6	"(i) The physician holds a board cer-
7	tification in addiction psychiatry or addic-
8	tion medicine from the American Board of
9	Medical Specialties.
10	"(ii) The physician holds a board cer-
11	tification from the American Board of Ad-
12	diction Medicine.
13	"(iii) The physician holds a board cer-
14	tification in addiction medicine from the
15	American Osteopathic Association.
16	"(iv) The physician has, with respect
17	to the treatment and management of pa-
18	tients with opioid or other substance use
19	disorders, completed not less than 8 hours
20	of training (through classroom situations,
21	seminars at professional society meetings,
22	electronic communications, or otherwise)
23	that is provided by—
24	"(I) the American Society of Ad-
25	diction Medicine, the American Acad-

1	emy of Addiction Psychiatry, the
2	American Medical Association, the
3	American Osteopathic Association, the
4	American Psychiatric Association, or
5	any other organization accredited by
6	the Accreditation Council for Con-
7	tinuing Medical Education (commonly
8	known as the 'ACCME');
9	"(II) any organization accredited
10	by a State medical society accreditor
11	recognized by the ACCME; or
12	"(III) any organization accred-
13	ited by the American Osteopathic As-
14	sociation to provide continuing med-
15	ical education.
16	"(v) The physician graduated in good
17	standing from an accredited school of
18	allopathic medicine or osteopathic medicine
19	in the United States during the 5-year pe-
20	riod immediately preceding the date on
21	which the physician first registers or re-
22	news under this section and has success-
23	fully completed a comprehensive allopathic
24	or osteopathic medicine curriculum or ac-
25	credited medical residency that included

1	not less than 8 hours of training on treat-
2	ing and managing patients with opioid and
3	other substance use disorders, including
4	the appropriate clinical use of all drugs ap-
5	proved by the Food and Drug Administra-
6	tion for the treatment of a substance use
7	disorder.
8	"(B) If the practitioner is not a physician,
9	the practitioner must meet one or more of the
10	following conditions:
11	"(i) Completed not fewer than 8 hours
12	of training with respect to the treatment
13	and management of patients with opioid or
14	other substance use disorders (through
15	classroom situations, seminars at profes-
16	sional society meetings, electronic commu-
17	nications, or otherwise) provided by the
18	American Society of Addiction Medicine,
19	the American Academy of Addiction Psy-
20	chiatry, the American Medical Association,
21	the American Osteopathic Association, the
22	American Nurses Credentialing Center, the
23	American Psychiatric Association, the
24	American Association of Nurse Practi-
25	tioners, the American Academy of Physi-

cian Assistants, or any other organization that the Secretary determines is appropriate for purposes of this clause.

"(ii) Graduated in good standing from 4 an accredited physician assistant school or 5 6 accredited school of advanced practice 7 nursing in the United States during the 5-8 year period immediately preceding the date 9 on which the practitioner first registers or renews under this section and has success-10 11 fully completed a comprehensive physician 12 assistant or advanced practice nursing cur-13 riculum that included not less than 8 hours 14 of training on treating and managing pa-15 tients with opioid and other substance use 16 disorders, including the appropriate clinical 17 use of all drugs approved by the Food and 18 Drug Administration for the treatment of 19 a substance use disorder.

"(3) ONE-TIME TRAINING.—The Attorney General shall not require any practitioner to complete
the training described in clause (iv) or (v) of paragraph
graph (2)(A) or clause (i) or (ii) of paragraph
(2)(B) more than once.

1 "(4) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in 2 this subsection shall be construed to prevent a prac-3 titioner from using the same training both for pur-4 poses of satisfying the registration requirement of 5 this subsection and for other purposes, such as satis-6 fying State licensing requirements.".

7 SEC. 3. PRACTITIONER EDUCATION GRANT PROGRAM.

8 Title V of the Public Health Service Act is amended
9 by inserting after section 509 of such Act (42 U.S.C.
10 290bb-2) the following:

11 "SEC. 510. PRACTITIONER EDUCATION GRANT PROGRAM.

12 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall carry out a 13 program to award grants to eligible entities to expand the 14 integration of substance use disorder education into the 15 standard curriculum of relevant health care and health 16 services education programs, thereby expanding the num-17 ber of practitioners who deliver high-quality, evidence-18 based substance use disorder treatment.

19 "(b) ELIGIBLE ENTITIES.—To be eligible to receive20 a grant under this section, an entity shall be—

"(1) a private nonprofit or public professional
association representing health care professionals in
the field of medicine, physician assistants, nursing,
social work, psychology, marriage and family therapy, or health services administration; or

"(2) a private nonprofit or public entity that is
 a university, college, or other professional school.

3 "(c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—To 4 carry out this section, there is authorized to be appro-5 priated such sums as may be necessary for each of fiscal 6 years 2022 through 2027.".
