# A BILL

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "COVID Vaccine Trans-3 portation Access Act".

#### 4 SEC. 2. GRANT PROGRAM FOR CORONAVIRUS VACCINE AC-

#### CESS AND MOBILITY.

6 (a) GENERAL AUTHORITY.—

7 (1)AWARDS.—The Secretary shall award 8 grants to qualified community organizations to as-9 sist in financing projects to remove transportation 10 barriers to accessing vaccines for SARS-CoV-2, in-11 cluding booster vaccines, for individuals from low-in-12 come communities, minority communities, or other 13 communities in which transportation poses a barrier 14 to health care access.

15 (2) TRANSFER OF DUTIES.—The Secretary
16 shall—

17 (A) enter into agreements with State
18 health agencies for purposes of carrying out the
19 duties assigned to the Secretary under this sec20 tion; and

(B) transfer to such agencies for such purposes funds appropriated to carry out this section.

(b) APPLICATION.—A qualified community organization seeking a grant under this section shall submit to the
Secretary an application that contains—

(1) a description of the project to be funded
 through the grant;

3 (2) an identification of all project partners and
4 their specific role in the proposed project, including
5 private for-profit and nonprofit entities engaged in
6 the coordination of transportation services for the
7 project; and

8 (3) specific performance measures the qualified
9 community organization will use to reduce cancella10 tions or missed appointments.

(c) PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE.—Each grant awarded under subsection (a) shall be for a period of performance of no less than 6 months.

14 (d) USE OF FUNDS.—Each grant awarded under
15 subsection (a)—

(1) shall be used to develop, expand, and enhance access to transportation to and from sites for
receipt of a vaccine for SARS-CoV-2, including a
booster vaccine, by individuals from low-income communities, minority communities, or other communities in which transportation poses a barrier to
health care access; and

24 (A) provide prescheduled or on-demand25 transportation to and from a site for adminis-

6	(e) REPORT.—As a condition on receipt of a grant
7	under this section, a grantee shall agree to submit a re-
8	port, not later than 6 months after the completion of the
9	period of performance of the grant—
10	(1) to the Secretary, the Committee on Energy
11	and Commerce of the House of Representatives, and
12	the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and
13	Pensions of the Senate; and
14	(2) containing such information the Secretary
15	determines necessary to evaluate performance under
16	the grant.
17	(f) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this section:
18	(1) FIRST AND LAST MILE.—The term "first
19	and last mile" means, with respect to transportation
20	services and an individual's trip to and from a vac-
21	cine appointment—
22	(A) transportation—
23	(i) between the individual's point of
24	trip origin and a source of public transit;
25	and

1	(ii) between a source of public transit
2	and the individual's destination; or
3	(B) where no source of public transit is
4	available, transportation between the individ-
5	ual's point of trip origin and the individual's
6	destination.
7	(2) QUALIFIED COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION.—
8	The term "qualified community organization" means
9	an organization that—
10	(A) is a nonprofit organization; and
11	(B) has experience in—
12	(i) managing Federal grants; and
13	(ii) providing services to low-income
14	or minority communities or communities
15	that disproportionately experience dispari-
16	ties in health status and health care ac-
17	cess.
18	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
19	the Secretary of Health and Human Services.
20	(g) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
21	are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be
22	necessary to carry out this section.
23	SEC. 3. FEDERAL MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PERCENTAGE.
24	Section 1905(b) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
25	1396d(b)) is amended by adding at the end the following

new sentence: "Notwithstanding the first sentence of this 1 2 subsection, the Federal medical assistance percentage 3 shall be 100 per centum with respect to amounts expended for nonemergency transportation benefits provided to indi-4 viduals eligible for medical assistance under this sub-5 chapter that are attributable to transportation costs in-6 7 curred on or after the date of the enactment of this sentence related to providing coronavirus vaccines to such in-8 dividuals under the State plan.". 9
