I have not had any active federal grants or contracts over the past 36 months. Caris, an organization for which I serve on the Board of Directors, provides research testing support for an ongoing National Cancer Institute study.

Stanford University School of Medicine is a research-intensive medical school with a long tradition of leadership in pioneering research. Over the past three fiscal years, the School of Medicine has received over 1,800 federal awards, totaling \$2.1 billion.

I have not received funding from a foreign government over the past 36 months. Caris, an organization for which I serve on the Board of Directors, has an active collaboration with the National Cancer Center Japan.

The Stanford University School of Medicine engages in partnerships with organizations across the globe, including, for example, awards from the governments of the United Kingdom and Norway totaling approximately \$250,000 over the past three fiscal years. Information about gifts and contracts from foreign sources received by Stanford can be found on the U.S. Department of Education's website. However, this publicly available data is broader than just the School of Medicine and includes information from across the university.


(B) In the case of a witness appearing in a non-governmental capacity, a written statement of proposed testimony shall include— (i) a curriculum vitae; (ii) a disclosure of any Federal grants or contracts, or contracts, grants, or payments originating with a foreign government, received during the past 36 months by the witness or by an entity represented by the witness and related to the subject matter of the hearing; and (iii) a disclosure of whether the witness is a fiduciary (including, but not limited to, a director, officer, advisor, or resident agent) of any organization or entity that has an interest in the subject matter of the hearing.

(C) The disclosure referred to in subdivision (B)(iii) shall include— (i) the amount and source of each Federal grant (or subgrant thereof) or contract (or subcontract thereof) related to the subject matter of the hearing; and (ii) the amount and country of origin of any payment or contract related to the subject matter of the hearing originating with a foreign government.

(D) Such statements, with appropriate redactions to protect the privacy or security of the witness, shall be made publicly available in electronic form 24 hours before the witness appears to the extent practicable, but not later than one day after the witness appears.
