

Janet E. Trunzo is Senior Advisor to the President and Senior Executive Vice President, Technology and Regulatory Affairs, for the Advanced Medical Technology Association (AdvaMed) and leads a team of regulatory experts. During her tenure at AdvaMed, she has focused on the passage of the Medical Device User Fee and Modernization Act of 2002 (MDUFA), its reauthorization in 2007, 2012, and 2017. She also concentrates on global regulatory harmonization and represents U.S. device industry on the APEC Regulatory Harmonization Steering Committee.
