19	tence: "Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed

1 including section 1115, that apply with respect to 2 medical assistance under the State plan under this 3 title, or waiver of such plan, for delivering care in 4 certain institutions for mental diseases with more 5 than 16 beds concurrently with this paragraph and 6 allowing for stays in such institutions for mental dis-7 eases equal to the combined total lengths of stays 8 permitted under the respective authorities so long as 9 all requirements for such authorities are met.". 10 (c) Codification of State Medicaid Director Letter #18-011.—Beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act, the State Medicaid Director Letter #18-12 13 011 shall have the force and effect of law, except that in 14 applying such letter, with respect to a State, the State 15 mental health director (or such other similar actor) may 16 allow for up to 45 days for the Statewide average length



of stay described in such letter.
