The Subcommittee on Health of the Committee on Energy and Commerce will meet in a hybrid open markup session on Wednesday, May 11, 2022, at 10:15 a.m. (EDT), and subsequent days as necessary, to consider the following legislation:

- H.R. 7233, the "Keeping Incarceration Discharges Streamlined for Child and Accommodating Resources in Education Act" or "KIDS CARES Act" (*Reps. Hudson (R-NC) and Kuster (D-NH) on 03/28/2022*)
- H.R. 623, the "Gabriella Miller Kids First Research Act 2.0" (Rep. Wexton (D-VA) and 17 original bipartisan cosponsors on 01/28/2021)
- H.R. 3771, the "South Asian Heart Health Awareness Act of 2021" (Rep. Jayapal (D-WA) and 19 original bipartisan cosponsors on 06/08/2021)
- H.R. 5585, the "Advanced Research Project Agency-Health Act" or "ARPA-H Act" (*Rep. Eshoo on 10/15/2021*)

This markup will take place in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, as well as remotely using Cisco WebEx online video conferencing. Members will receive WebEx participant access information by email before the markup. No staff from member's offices will be allowed in the Committee room. However, one staffer from each members' office may join the markup remotely as an attendee on WebEx. Each designated staff attendee should register at the

For members planning to attend in person, the Committee notes that this markup is being held during the COVID-19 pandemic, therefore the Committee will adhere to the greatest extent possible to the safety guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Attending Physician of the Capitol.
