**3 SECTION 1. REPORT ON FEDERAL EFFORTS TO ADDRESS**

- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Comptroller General of the6 United States shall—
- 7 (1) prepare a report on efforts of the Federal8 Government to address antimicrobial resistance; and

2	actment of this Act—
3	(A) finalize such report; and
4	(B) submit such report to the Congress.
5	(b) CONTENTS.—The report required by subsection
6	(a) shall—
7	(1) address all efforts of the Federal Govern-
8	ment regarding antimicrobial resistance, including
9	any such efforts involving—
10	(A) establishing, maintaining, or operating
11	a task force, committee, or interagency pro-
12	gram; or
13	(B) developing a plan or report;
14	(2) specify the role of each Federal program
15	and resource in such efforts;

(7) with respect to research being federally con ducted or supported with respect to antimicrobial re sistance—

(A) quantify of the costs of such research; 4 (B) if any such research is identified as 5 duplicative pursuant to paragraph (3), rec-6 ommend approaches for coordinating or consoli-7 dating such research to avoid duplication; and 8 9 (C) recommend whether there should be a central Federal agency to oversee such re-10 11 search.
