

1 (42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq.) (or a waiver of such plan),
2 including—

3 (A) general information about Medicaid
4 buy-in program eligibility;

5 (B) which States offer Medicaid buy-in
6 programs; and

7 (C) the specific eligibility requirements of
8 such programs;

9 (2) information about how to contact each
10 State's Medicaid office for information about Med-
11 icaid and Children's Health Insurance Program eli-
12 gibility, including links and phone numbers for State
13 contacts;

14 (3) information on individual community-based
15 services and long-term support services available to
16 individuals eligible for medical assistance under a
17 State plan under the Medicaid program under title
18 XIX of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396 et
19 seq.) (or a waiver of such plan);

20 (4) where applicable, the duration of wait lists
21 to receive the services described in paragraph (3);

22 (5) where applicable, alternative and supple-
23 mental supports that may be available while an indi-
24 vidual waits to receive the services described in para-
25 graph (3); and

1 (6) a searchable database of such resources, or
2 local resource hubs, that may be searched by geo-
3 graphical area.

4 (b) PROMOTION.—The Secretary shall, as applicable
5 and appropriate, identify and disseminate promotional ac-
6 tivities to improve, among people with a disability and the
7 caretakers and families of such people, the awareness of
8 the resources included in the website established under
9 subsection (a), such as through collaboration with the So-
10 cial Security Administration during its annual updates to
11 the Red Book.

12 (c) MODEL.—In establishing the website under this
13 section, the Secretary may use the website
14 thinkdifferently.net as a model.

Amend the title to read as follows: “A Bill to direct
the Secretary of Health and Human Services to establish
a website to promote awareness of available resources for
individuals with disabilities, and for other purposes.”.
