- Reduced daily case count by over 99% compared to peak of the outbreak since beginning of coordination role
- Developed funding flexibilities created to support the mpox response in collaboration with multiple agencies to generate a "syndemic" response:
  - HRSA Ryan White allowed for use of resources to support mpox treatment and vaccination.
  - CDC HIV and STD funding and staff were allowed to be used for mpox work without specific approval.
  - SAMHSA allows use of funds and staff in substance abuse and mental health programs to navigate and provide support for people affected by mpox or in need of vaccine.
  - HUD created flexibilities to assist with housing of people affected by mpox and those in need of isolation and quarantine space.

## Mpox Vaccine

- Worked with FDA to facilitate EUA for intradermal dosing, effectively increasing vaccine stores by 4-5 fold and addressing acute supply issues.

- Conducted extensive community and jurisdictional engagement to address community concerns over ID dosing and implementation
- Supported rapid implementation of intradermal dosing-Within 3 weeks of EUA allowing for ID dosing, 80% of doses were administered through this route
- Worked with Bavarian Nordic to increase off shore production of vaccine
- Supported the established a fill and finish plant in Michigan (GRAM) to establish domestic vaccine source and to accelerate supply.
- Supported the development of a weekly graphic that shares supply and utilization of mpox vaccine on the ASPR website.
- Facilitated early release of vaccine performance data on the CDC website that supports mpox vaccine strategy.
- Supported NIH launched of MVA-BN trial: Evaluate the Immunogenicity of Dose Reduction Strategies of the MVA-BN Monkeypox Vaccine
- Supported CDC expansion of eligibility of vaccine to a larger number of people at-risk
- Supported the amendment of the PREP act to facilitate vaccine administration by pharmacists and other health care providers

 Facilitated simplification of EA-IND to ease provider workload for accessing TPOXX (2-3 hours of paperwork down to 15 min)

- Supported the launch of a domestic study of TPOXX by NIH
- Facilitated the posting data on demographics of people using TPOXX through the CDC EA-IND to increase transparency per community request

 Worked with CDC to increased testing capacity from 6000 tests per week to 80,000 tests per week

- Collaborated with CDC to produce new <u>syndemic focused</u> <u>resource</u> to communicate health behaviors to LGBTQ people prior to summer 2023.

## Equity

- Participated in over 700 engagements to support a community driven response to mpox
- Successfully provided strong and repeated feedback to the World Health Organization about the need to accelerate the change in nomenclature of monkeypox to mpox
- Established a monthly White House mpox Workshop co-hosted by OASH comprised of people from affected communities to discuss personal and organizational experiences to improve response equity.
- Named Kay Hayes from OASH as mpox Senior Advisor for Equity
- Worked with FDA and CDC to allow for vaccination on body sites other than the forearm to address stigma concerns raised by community

- Worked with CDC to lift the requirement for a detailed risk assessment to eliminate a barrier to people accessing vaccine (eg- no longer need to say that you are a gay man with multiple partners to qualify for vaccine- asking is enough)
- Launched Equity interventions to bring vaccine to people who might not seek care in standard venues
  - 10 Large events. Examples:
    - Atlanta Black Pride with over 4200 vaccines administered
    - Southern Decadence with 7,000 vaccines administered
    - Castro and Folsom street fair >10,000 vaccines administered
  - Over 25 smaller events launched
  - Based on these events, CDC launched a "community of practice" for jurisdictions and service providers to learn from equity-focused interventions
  - Two MMWRs released detailing Atlanta Black Pride and Southern Decadence work
- o "Summer of Pride" Syndemic Team
  - Conceived of a cross-agency pilot project to use forecasting data to identify 25-30 Black and Brownfocused events in areas at-risk for mpox resurgence.
  - Identified and empowered team leadership with lived community experience to lead the team.
  - Cross-linked HRSA-Ryan White, CDC, SAMSHA, and HUD staff in a "tiger team" to support jurisdictions and events to create holistic, community focused wellness plans that include HIV/STI services, mental health and harm reduction services, and housing services.
  - Embedded this effort in the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Health (OASH) to support sustainability.
