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Dr. DiGiorgio earned his medical degree from Touro University College of Osteopathic Medicine after completing his bachelor's in biology at UC Santa Barbara. He completed his neurosurgery residency at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center in New Orleans, where he concurrently earned a Master of Health Administration. A leader in health policy, Dr. DiGiorgio's research focuses on healthcare costs, reducing administrative burdens, advancing real-time clinical registries, and improving access for low-income patients.
