

Dr. Rick Snyder is an interventional cardiologist and President of HeartPlace, one of the largest independent cardiology practices in Texas, serving patients in 10 counties across the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex. He is also Vice President of the American Independent Medical Practice Association, a national organization that advocates on behalf of 14,000 physicians caring for more than 40 million patients in independent medical practices in 48 states.

Dr. Snyder previously served as President of the Texas Medical Association and has held numerous leadership roles within organized medicine, including with the American College of Cardiology, the Society for Cardiovascular Angiography and Interventions, and the Dallas County Health and Human Services Public Health Advisory Committee. He has practiced cardiology in North Texas for more than three decades and is a recognized advocate for independent physician practice, patient access, and healthcare affordability.
