

Michael K. Smith is Vermont state president of FairPoint Communications, Inc., and also heads up FairPoint's corporate communications efforts both regionally and nationally.

Following a stint as general manager of the Public Employer Risk Management Association (PERMA) in Albany, New York, Mr. Smith was appointed deputy state treasurer for the state of Vermont under Treasurer James H. Douglas, serving from 1995-99. He was named chief operating officer and executive vice president of Yankee Captive Management in South Burlington, Vermont in 1999 and was appointed secretary of administration by Governor James H. Douglas in 2003. In 2005, Mr. Smith was appointed secretary of human services and then reappointed secretary of administration by Governor Douglas in 2006.

Smith is a graduate of the University of Vermont in Burlington, from which he earned a master's degree and a bachelor's degree in Political Science. Mike recently served as a member of the Vermont Pension Investment Committee and currently sits on the boards of Spectrum Youth & Family Services, the Flynn Center, Vermont Student Assistance Corp. and the Lake Champlain Regional Chamber of Commerce. He also holds an Associate in Risk Management (ARM) designation from the American Institute for CPCU and Insurance Institute of America.

Smith is a native of Vermont. He lives in Westford with his wife Mary and has two grown children.
