BILLY JACK GREGG Curriculum Vitae

Billy Jack Gregg has been a lawyer and consultant for 39 years, and is currently the principal in the firm Billy Jack Gregg Universal Consulting, which specializes in telecommunications and energy issues. Mr. Gregg served as Director of the Consumer Advocate Division of the West Virginia Public Service Commission from the time the office was created in 1981 until he retired from state government in 2007. As Consumer Advocate, Mr. Gregg represented West Virginians in all major proceedings affecting rates for electricity, gas, telephone and water. Prior to this position, Mr. Gregg was the senior staff attorney in the Field Solicitor's Office of the U.S. Department of Interior in Charleston, West Virginia; was in private practice in Hurricane, West Virginia; and served as Assistant Attorney General assigned to the West Virginia Human Rights Commission.

Mr. Gregg attended the University of Glasgow, Scotland, and received a B.A. degree in history and government from Austin College in Sherman, Texas. He earned his law degree from the University of Texas in Austin, Texas.

Mr. Gregg served on the FCC's Federal-State Joint Board on Universal Service from 2002 to 2007. He also served as Treasurer and a member of the Executive Committee of the National Association of State Utility Consumer Advocates (NASUCA), as a member of the FCC's Rural Task Force, as a member of the Board of Directors of the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC), and as a member of the Board of Directors of the National Regulatory Research Institute (NRRI).
