

Jim Campbell leads an organization that is responsible for regulatory and legislative affairs and developing and maintaining relationships with key elected officials in CenturyLink's Midwest Region. He was Arizona state president for Qwest before the company's acquisition by CenturyLink 2011.

Campbell held several positions at Qwest and its predecessor, U S West. He started at U S West in 1995, focusing on mergers and acquisitions. In 1998, Campbell joined MediaOne, the subsidiary of U S West, where he was vice president of Law and Government Affairs for Eastern U.S. operations based in Florida. When MediaOne was sold to AT&T in 2000, Campbell returned to Denver after U S West had merged with Qwest to support video operations in Arizona and Colorado. From 2001 to 2008, he was managing partner at the law firm of Campbell, Killin, Brittan and Ray in Denver. Campbell rejoined Qwest in 2008 as Arizona state president.

Campbell has served on the boards of many organizations, including the Denver and Southwest chapters of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of America, the Valley of the Sun United Way in Phoenix, the 2011 MLB All Star Game advisory committee, and the Arizona Chamber of Commerce and Industry. He is based in Denver.
