Elizabeth Bowles is the President and Chairman of the Board of Aristotle Inc., a full-service interactive media agency and broadband Internet service provider headquartered in Little Rock, Arkansas. Ms. Bowles served as the President of the Wireless Internet Service Providers Association (WISPA) from 2010-2013 and is the current WISPA Legislative Committee Chair. A member of the Arkansas and American Bar Associations, Ms. Bowles is a nationally recognized expert on Internet security, law, privacy, and technology.

Ms. Bowles graduated summa cum laude from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock with a B.A. in International Studies. From there, she received her J.D. from Vanderbilt University School of Law, where she was first in her class. Ms. Bowles earned the top score on the Arkansas Bar Exam and is licensed to practice law in Arkansas, the District of Columbia, the Supreme Court of the United States, and various U.S. Courts of Appeal. Prior to coming to Aristotle, Ms. Bowles clerked for then Chief Judge of the Eighth Circuit, Richard S. Arnold. Following her clerkship, Elizabeth was an associate at Arnold & Porter in Washington, D.C., where her litigation practice focused on technology and international issues. She joined Aristotle in 2000.

Ms. Bowles is the outgoing Chair of the Arkansas State Bank Board, the current Chapter Chair for the Arkansas Chapter of YPO (Young President's Association), and an active member of both WISPA and FISPA, a "how-to" organization for small- to mid-sized CLECs. Over the years, Ms. Bowles has served on the boards of numerous community, charitable, and non-profit organizations.
