I alone survived the political grind and was keynote speaker at the dedication.

The next passion that arose in my political life was the National League of Cities. Through involvement in the Information Technology and Communications Advocacy Committee for the last 8 years, I have enjoyed writing policy for Federal advocacy and seeing those policies come to fruition in the Federal landscape. During this year of COVID I have served as Chair of ITC while concurrently serving on the Federal Communications Commission - IAC (Intergovernmental Advisory Committee) on behalf of NLC.

I have also served during 2020-2021 as a member of the NLC Board of Directors which I hope to continue for another two years.

LRC has raised an average of \$40,000/ year for literacy projects in our school district, and I enjoy catching those ducks in the cool river while others swelter in the August heat.

Loveland is a truly amazing community. Nestled in the foothills, we enjoy great weather with all 4 seasons, beautiful fall colors, followed by graceful blankets of snow.

Loveland is my home and always will be.
