Chapman, a lifelong and 2nd generation broadcaster, began as a television sportscaster and play-by-play announcer working in large and small markets. Moving from in front of the camera, he worked for Emmis Communications for 17 years in various sales and management roles. Later as a Market Manager in Rockford, Illinois, his stations consistently achieved excellent results despite economic and industry disruptions.
