MEMORANDUM

Re: Subcommittee on Communications and Technology Markup

I. INTRODUCTION

The Subcommittee on Communications and Technology will hold a markup on Thursday, January 15, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. (ET) in 2123 Rayburn House Office Building. The markup will consider the following legislation:

- H.R. 6505, Next Generation 9-1-1 Act (Reps. Hudson and Carter–LA)
- H.R. 2076, LuLu’s Law (Rep. Palmer)
- H.R. 5200, Emergency Reporting Act (Reps. Matsui and Bilirakis)
- H.R. 5201, Kari’s Law Reporting Act (Reps. Matsui and Bilirakis)
- H.R. 7022, Mystic Alerts Act (Reps. Pfluger and Fletcher)
- H.R. 1519, Public Safety Communications Act (Rep. Cammack)

II. LEGISLATION

A. H.R. 6505, Next Generation 9-1-1 Act (Reps. Hudson and Carter–LA)

This bill amends the National Telecommunications and Information Administration Organization Act to provide for further deployment and coordination of Next Generation 9–1–1.

B. H.R. 2076, LuLu’s Law (Rep. Palmer)

This bill requires the Federal Communications Commission to issue an order explicitly permitting the transmission of wireless emergency alerts to mobile phones in the event of a shark attack.

C. H.R. 5200, Emergency Reporting Act (Reps. Matsui and Bilirakis)

This bill directs the Federal Communications Commission to issue reports after activation of the Disaster Information Reporting System and to make improvements to network outage reporting.

D. H.R. 5201, Kari's Law Reporting Act (Reps. Matsui and Bilirakis)

This bill directs the Federal Communications Commission to publish a report on implementation of the Kari's Law Act of 2017.

E. H.R. 7022, Mystic Alerts Act (Reps. Pfluger and Fletcher)

This bill would require the Federal Communications Commission to issue a rulemaking establishing standards and protocols to facilitate satellite alerting capabilities for commercial mobile service providers that transmit emergency alerts.

F. H.R. 1519, Public Safety Communications Act (Rep. Cammack)

This bill provides statutory authority for the Office of Public Safety Communications within the National Telecommunications and Information Administration to support efforts related to public safety communications.
