Shiva Goel is a partner at Wiley Rein LLP and a non-resident adjunct fellow with the Center for Strategic and International Studies. At Wiley Rein, he advises and advocates for companies in the telecommunications, space, and emerging technology sectors on a broad range of regulatory, national security, and strategic matters and co-chairs the Wireless Practice Group. He focuses his practice at the intersection of law, policy, and innovation and has significant experience representing clients in high-stakes regulatory, appellate, and commercial matters before the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), federal courts, and enforcement agencies. He also provides guidance on rules, regulations, and judicial decisions affecting emerging technologies, and supports technology, telecommunications, and investment firms in commercial transactions, including mergers and acquisitions regulated by the FCC.

Before joining Wiley, Shiva served as the Senior Advisor for Spectrum Policy at the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA), where he managed the federal government's multitrillion-dollar spectrum portfolio and agency-wide space and satellite policy initiatives on behalf of the NTIA Administrator. At NTIA, Shiva led the agency's efforts to advance U.S. national and economic security by expanding access to scarce wireless spectrum, including through its implementation of the National Spectrum Strategy. Under his leadership, NTIA successfully completed studies identifying hundreds of megahertz of spectrum for expanded commercial access and blueprinted and funded additional efforts to expand spectrum access in highly complex and contested mid-band frequencies.

Shiva joined NTIA from the FCC, where he served as legal adviser to Commissioner Geoffrey Starks on wireless, space, and international policy matters. He was previously a partner in the telecom, appellate, and litigation practices of HWG LLP and began his legal career as a law clerk to the Honorable Louis L. Stanton of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York and the Honorable Maryanne Trump Barry of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit. He received his law degree, Order of the Coif, from the University of Virginia School of Law and a BA from Cornell University.
