Jason Levine is the Executive Director of the Center for Auto Safety and is a consumer protection advocate and attorney.

In this role Mr. Levine is regularly called on to promote vehicle safety on behalf of consumers. Before joining public service, he worked as an attorney in private practice in Washington, DC.

Jason has long been involved in his community, both close to home and nationally. Currently, he serves as a board member of Advocates for Highway and Auto Safety as well as the Canadian Automobile Protection Association. On the local level, he served seven years on the Board of Directors for the Washington, DC Chapter of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation, fulfilled a term each as Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Montgomery County, Maryland Advisory Committee on Consumer Protection; and as a Commissioner of the Montgomery County, Maryland Commission on Health.
