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SUMMARY

My clinical, educational, and research programs focus on the impact of treating sleep disorders on neurological disease. My own research has emphasized the interface of sleep and epilepsy, autism, and related disorders of neurodevelopment. Through collaborations and mentorship, I am also involved in the study of sleep as relates to medical disorders as well as aspects of sleep medicine related to genetics and circadian biology. I hold an endowed chair, the Burry Chair in Cognitive Childhood Development and serve as Vice Chair for Academic Affairs in our Department of Neurology. In addition to conducting my own NIH and foundation-funded patient-oriented research, I have taken an active role in facilitating patient-oriented research through my involvement as Director of Clinical Translational Research for the Vanderbilt Kennedy Center. I serve as PI for the Vanderbilt site of the NeuroNEXT Network (NINDS Network of Excellence in Neuroscience Clinical Trials). I also serve as the principal investigator for Vanderbilt's Autism Care Network, one of several regional centers across North America developing standards of medical care for children with autism. I direct the Vanderbilt Sleep Disorders Division, which includes two multidisciplinary sleep centers accredited by the American Academy of Sleep Medicine and an ACGME-accredited fellowship program in sleep medicine. I completed the Executive Leadership Program in Academic Medicine (ELAM). I serve as Vice-Chair of the Tennessee Autism Council. My pursuits outside of work involve promoting harmony- -I sing a cappella, co-facilitate Common Ground Nashville, a community group focused on civil discourse, and am a national moderator for Braver Angels, focused on bridging the political divide.
