**SUBCOMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND COMMERCE
HYBRID MARKUP**

THURSDAY, JUNE 23, 2022

The Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce of the Committee on Energy and Commerce met, pursuant to notice, at 10:39 a.m., a quorum being present, for a hybrid markup in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building and on the Committee's Webex platform, Hon. Jan Schakowsky (Chair of the subcommittee) presiding. The business before the Subcommittee was consideration and markup of eight bills. The following actions were taken:

1. [H.R. 8152](#), the "American Data Privacy and Protection Act," was ordered reported favorably to the full Committee, **amended**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 8152:

- **An Amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS) #1** ([PRIVACY ANS 01](#)), offered by Mr. Pallone, was agreed to by a voice vote.
- **An Amendment to the AINS #1a** ([LESKO 093](#)), offered by Ms. Lesko, was withdrawn.
- **An Amendment to the AINS #1b** ([ARMSND 031](#)), offered by Mr. Armstrong, was withdrawn.
- **An Amendment to the AINS #1c** ([ARMSND 032](#)), offered by Mr. Armstrong, was withdrawn.
- **An Amendment to the AINS #1d** ([ARMSND 033](#)), offered by Mr. Armstrong, was withdrawn.

2. [H.R. 3355](#), the "Save America's Forgotten Equines Act of 2021" or the "SAFE Act" was ordered reported favorably to the full Committee, **amended**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 3355:

- **An Amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS) #1** ([SLW 0187](#)), offered by Ms. Schakowsky, was agreed to by a voice vote.
- **An Amendment to the AINS #1a** ([ARMSND 030](#)), offered by Mr. Armstrong, was withdrawn.

3. [H.R. 3962](#), the “Securing and Enabling Commerce Using Remote and Electronic Notarization Act of 2021,” was ordered reported favorably to the full Committee, **without amendment**, by a roll call vote of 22 yeas to 0 nays ([CPC Roll Call No. 5](#)) (**Final Passage**).

No amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 3962.

4. [H.R. 4081](#), the “Informing Consumers about Smart Devices Act,” was ordered reported favorably to the full Committee, **without amendment**, by a roll call vote of 21 yeas to 0 nays ([CPC Roll Call No. 6](#)) (**Final Passage**).

No amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 4081.

5. [H.R. 4551](#), the “Reporting Attacks from Nations Selected for Oversight and Monitoring Web Attacks and Ransomware from Enemies Act” or the “RANSOMWARE Act,” was ordered reported favorably to the full Committee, **without amendment**, by a roll call vote of 22 yeas to 0 nays ([CPC Roll Call No. 7](#)) (**Final Passage**).

No amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 4551.

6. [H.R. 5313](#), “Reese’s Law,” was ordered reported favorably to the full Committee, **amended**, by a roll call vote of 21 yeas to 0 nays ([CPC Roll call No. 8](#)) (**Final Passage**).

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 5313:

- **An Amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS) #1** ([SLW_0186](#)), offered by Ms. Kelly, was agreed to by a voice vote.

7. [H.R. 5441](#), the “Prevent All Soring Tactics Act of 2021” or the “PAST Act of 2021,” was ordered reported favorably to the full Committee, **amended**, by a roll call vote of 22 yeas to 0 nays ([CPC Roll Call No. 9](#)) (**Final Passage**).

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 5441:

- **An Amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS) #1** ([SLW_0188](#)), offered by Ms. Schakowsky, was agreed to by a voice vote.

8. [H.R. 6290](#), the “Manufacturing.gov Act,” was ordered reported favorably to the full Committee, **without amendment**, by a roll call vote of 22 yeas to 0 nays ([CPC Roll Call No. 10](#)) (**Final Passage**).

No amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 6290.
