Scott N. Paul is president of the Alliance for American Manufacturing (AAM), a partnership established in 2007 by some of America's leading manufacturers and the United Steelworkers union. Scott and AAM have worked to make American manufacturing and "Made in America" top-of-mind concerns for voters and our national leaders through effective advocacy, policy development, and data-driven research.

Scott is a sought-after expert on trade and manufacturing matters, testifying before numerous congressional committees and penning op-eds for <u>The New York Times</u> and other leading publications. He authored a chapter in the 2013 book <u>ReMaking America</u> and has written extensively about <u>Alexander Hamilton's role</u> in forming U.S. national economic policy. Scott also hosts the <u>The Manufacturing Report</u> podcast.

Scott sits on the Board of Visitors of the Political Science Department at the Pennsylvania State University and the Advisory Board of Indiana University's Manufacturing Policy Initiative. He served on the board of the National Skills Coalition from 2013 to 2022.
