Biography

William E. Allmond, IV
Vice President, Government & Public Relations
Society of Chemical Manufacturers & Affiliates

Bill Allmond is Vice President of Government & Public Relations for the Society of Chemical Manufacturers & Affiliates (SOCMA), the only U.S. association representing specialty, batch, and custom chemical manufacturing since 1921. He joined the SOCMA staff in February 2007.



In his capacity, Allmond leads SOCMA's seven-person Government Relations department, is the senior lobbyist for SOCMA's mission issues, and directs the department's signature programs: ChemAlliance®, PMNPro®, and SOCMA CONNECT. He also oversees the management of SOCMA's Public Relations department.

While at SOCMA, Bill has led the association's increased advocacy and visibility on Capitol Hill and inside regulatory agencies. He also oversaw the launch of SOCMA's grassroots initiative, which has exceeded recruitment goals and oversaw five successful member Fly-Ins. In 2012, Allmond oversaw SOCMA's first-ever PR effort aimed at Capitol Hill, for which full page ads were published in *Roll Call* and a new educational website, both designed to raise greater awareness of life-enhancing contributions made possible by the specialty chemical manufacturing industry. He also served for three years as the Assistant Chair of the Chemical Sector Coordinating Council. Currently Allmond is serving as a Board Member of two state chemical councils, the Chemical Industry Council of California and the Pennsylvania Chemical Industry Council. He is regularly quoted on legislative and regulatory topics in industry publications, such as *Bloomberg BNA*, *Chemical & Engineering News*, *ICIS Chemical Business*, *Pesticide and Chemical Policy*, and *Chemical Week*, as well as in national publications such as *The New York Times* and the *National Journal*. In addition to print media, Bill has also appeared on live radio and covered by C-SPAN.

Prior to joining SOCMA, Allmond served 10 years as Director of Regulatory & Public Affairs at the National Association of Chemical Distributors and three years at the Recreation Vehicle Dealers Association as Manager of Industry & Government Affairs.

Allmond is a graduate of George Mason University, earning a Bachelor of Arts in English and has served two terms as Director-At-Large on its Alumni Association Board of Directors and president of the Washington, DC Metro chapter.
