

Lemuel M. Srolovic

Lemuel M. Srolovic is the Bureau Chief of the Environmental Protection Bureau in the office of the New York State Attorney General Eric T. Schneiderman. The Bureau enforces state and federal environmental laws in state and federal courts, defends state agencies on environmental matters, and recovers mediation costs expended by the state.

Before his appointment to lead the Environmental Protection Bureau, Lem represented people around the county harmed by toxic chemicals as an attorney with Weitz & Luxenberg.

Lem also served in the New York Attorney General's office as a Section Chief of Affirmative Litigation.

Before first joining the New York State Attorney General's office, Lem was a partner and associate at Sive, Paget and Riesel, a New York City-based environmental law firm. At Sive Paget, Lem represented businesses, industry and individuals in environmental matters.

Lem received his law degree from New York University School of Law, where he was Editor in Chief of the *NYU Journal of International Law & Politics*. Following law school, Lem clerked for the Honorable Robert G. Doumar, Senior U.S. District Judge in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia. Lem received his undergraduate degree from Touro College in New York City.
