

Its core functions include monitoring, assessment and standards; pollution control; compliance management; and cleanups. Additional functions include policy development and citizen outreach on environmental issues. ADEQ is currently comprised of four divisions: Air Quality; Water Quality; Waste Programs; and Administrative Services.

Director Darwin has dedicated his professional studies and career to environmental protection. He is a trained hydrologist and licensed attorney with over 19 years of experience in developing and implementing environmental policy in Arizona.
