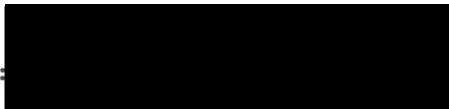

Edward F. (Ward) Sproat, III

Mr. Sproat held the position of Director of the Office of Civilian Radioactive Waste Management (RW-1) in the U.S. Department of Energy until January 2009. He was nominated for that position by President George W. Bush in September of 2005 and was confirmed by the U.S. Senate in May 2006. During his tenure, he successfully led the efforts to develop and submit to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission the license application for the Nation's high-level radioactive waste repository at Yucca Mountain, Nevada.

Mr. Sproat holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering and a Master of Science degree in Dynamics of Organizations, both from the University of Pennsylvania. He completed the Executive Development Program at Cornell University.

Mr. Sproat also previously held the position of Vice President of International Projects for Exelon Generation. In this position he was responsible for developing and managing the Exelon interests in various international generation ventures. He was a director on the board of PBMR (Pebble Bed Modular Reactor) Pty. LTD in the Republic of South Africa. While in this position, Exelon was requested by the PBMR board to allow Mr. Sproat to assume the duties of Chief Operating Officer. He assumed those duties in January 2002 working full time in South Africa until the deliverables requested by the board were successfully delivered in December 2002.

Mr. Sproat held various management positions with Exelon's predecessor PECO Energy over a 29 year career. He was the Director of Strategic Programs for PECO Nuclear. In this position, he was responsible for all License Renewal projects for the PECO/AmerGen fleet, the development and execution of an integrated strategy for the disposal of spent nuclear fuel, and the evaluation of advanced reactor concepts. In this position he was the lead negotiator for PECO and successfully concluded the first negotiated settlement between a utility and the US DOE regarding the Government's failure to perform in accordance with the Standard Contract for spent fuel disposal. He also held the positions of Director of Engineering for the entire PECO Nuclear fleet as well as Director of Engineering and Director of Maintenance at the Limerick Nuclear Generating Station. He was directly responsible for the electrical design and licensing activities for the Limerick Nuclear Generating Station during its design and construction phases.

Mr. Sproat is currently with Bechtel National, Inc. He is assigned to the Waste Treatment Plant Project in Hanford, WA as the Manager of Site Integration. He has also been Bechtel's Project Director for the Calvert Cliffs 3 and Watts Bar 2 nuclear power plant projects.
