Hardy Manufacturing was formed in 1976 by Jerome Hardy, Frank's father in law, to build an outdoor wood burning heater to provide heat for homes in rural areas. Frank received a BS in Engineering from Mississippi State University in 1973. He is married with three daughters and four grandchildren. After 13 years at a Utility Co. and a Pump Manufacturer in Memphis, TN., Frank and his family moved to Philadelphia in 1987 as the Plant Engineer for Hardy.
