## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Energy to review and update a report on the energy and environmental benefits of the re-refining of used lubricating oil.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ENERGY SAVINGS FROM LUBRICATING OIL.**

4 Not later than one year after the date of enactment  
5 of this Act, the Secretary of Energy, in cooperation with  
6 the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agen-  
7 cy and the Director of the Office of Management and  
8 Budget, shall—

1           (1) review and update the report prepared pur-  
2           suant to section 1838 of the Energy Policy Act of  
3           2005;

4           (2) after consultation with relevant Federal,  
5           State, and local agencies and affected industry and  
6           stakeholder groups, update data that was used in  
7           preparing that report; and

8           (3) prepare and submit to Congress a coordi-  
9           nated Federal strategy to increase the beneficial  
10          reuse of used lubricating oil, that—

11           (A) is consistent with national policy as es-  
12          tablished pursuant to section 2 of the Used Oil  
13          Recycling Act of 1980 (Public Law 96–463);  
14          and

15          (B) addresses measures needed to—

16           (i) increase the responsible collection  
17          of used oil;

18           (ii) disseminate public information  
19          concerning sustainable reuse options for  
20          used oil; and

21           (iii) promote sustainable reuse of used  
22          oil by Federal agencies, recipients of Fed-  
23          eral grant funds, entities contracting with

1 the Federal Government, and the general  
2 public.
