Frank J. Macchiarola

Frank J. Macchiarola is Group Director of Downstream and Industry Operations at the American Petroleum Institute (API). Mr. Macchiarola joined API on January 1, 2016. He leads association efforts on fuels, refining, marketing and downstream safety, security and technology.

Prior to joining API, Mr. Macchiarola served as Executive Vice President of Government Affairs at America's Natural Gas Alliance (ANGA). At ANGA, he led the association's federal and state government affairs functions, representing North America's largest independent natural gas exploration and production companies. Mr. Macchiarola strategically integrated ANGA's government affairs activities with its broader advocacy resources, including communications, market development and policy & research. He also negotiated the asset purchase of ANGA by API and coordinated the due diligence and integration processes associated with the transaction.

From 2004 to 2013, Mr. Macchiarola served in a number of senior staff positions in the United States Senate. He was Minority Staff Director of the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions, and he also served as Staff Director, Minority Staff Director, and Counsel to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.

During his tenure with the Senate Energy Committee, Mr. Macchiarola served as top advisor to then-Chairman Pete V. Domenici (R-NM). He assisted in drafting the *Energy Policy Act of 2005*, served as principal staff author of the *Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act of 2006*, and led the Republican staff during consideration and passage of the *Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007* and the *America COMPETES Act of 2007*.

In his role at the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions, Mr. Macchiarola served as top advisor to then-Ranking Member Mike Enzi (R-WY), and the Republican committee members during the debate and consideration of national health care reform in 2009 and 2010. He also managed a number of legislative reforms to the Food and Drug Administration and oversaw the Minority response to the congressional investigation of private-sector institutions of higher education.

Mr. Macchiarola was previously a partner in the policy resolution group at Bracewell & Giuliani LLP (now Bracewell LLP), and he began his career as an associate in the litigation group of Tannenbaum, Helporn, Syracuse & Hirschtritt, LLP in New York City.

Mr. Macchiarola earned his B.A. from the College of the Holy Cross in 1998 and J.D. from New York University School of Law in 2002. His bar admissions include New York State and the United States District Court for the Eastern and Southern Districts of New York.
