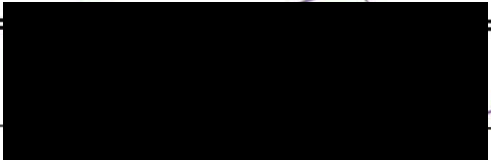

**Peter Grevatt, Ph.D.**

Peter Grevatt is the Director of the Office of Ground Water and Drinking Water. The Office of Ground Water and Drinking Water in collaboration with states, tribes and its many stakeholders, is responsible for safeguarding America's drinking water.

He is responsible for the development and implementation of national drinking water standards, oversight and funding of state drinking water programs and the implementation of source water protection and underground injection control programs to protect public health nationwide. Peter Grevatt also leads the cross-agency effort to address per- and poly-fluoralkyl (PFAS) substances including PFOA, PFOS and GenX.

Prior to joining the OGWDW in October of 2012, Peter Grevatt served as the Director of the Office of Children's Health Protection and served as the Senior Advisor to EPA's Administrator for Children's Environmental Health. Peter has held leadership roles in EPA's national hazardous waste and water quality programs.
