Sam Thernstrom is the founder and chief executive officer of the **Energy Innovation Reform Project** (EIRP), a nonprofit organization working to promote the development of advanced energy technologies and practices that will improve the affordability, reliability, safety and security of American energy supplies and our energy economy.

He is also founder and executive director of the **Innovation Reform Action Project**, a 501c4 nonprofit organization working to advance pragmatic solutions to clean energy challenges.

He is also a senior fellow at the Center for the National Interest.

Previously, he was senior climate policy advisor to the Clean Air Task Force (2010-12), director of communications at the White House Council on Environmental Quality (2001-03), and resident fellow at the American Enterprise Institute for Public Policy Research (2003-2010), where he co-directed a project exploring the public policy implications of geoengineering. He also served as senior policy advisor to the Bipartisan Policy Commission's Geoengineering Task Force (2010-11), speechwriter to George E. Pataki, Governor of New York (1999-2000), and press secretary at the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (1996-1999).

His writing has been published in the *Wall Street Journal*, *New York Times*, *Los Angeles Times*, the *Washington Post*, *The Weekly Standard*, *National Review*, *Electricity Journal*, *The Environmental Forum*, *The New Republic*, *The American*, and Bloomber, and he has appeared on ABC News, BBC News, CNN, Fox News, NPR, The NewsHour with Jim Lehrer on PBS, and the Daily Show with Jon Stewart.
