Jimmy Conde is partner at Boyden Gray PLLC, specializing in energy, environmental, and administrative law and regulation, with a particular focus on the Clean Air Act.

Mr. Conde's recent representative cases include representing small businesses and farmers in challenges to federal and state electric-vehicle mandates, winning a record-based challenge to EPA backdoor fuel economy mandates in *Texas Corn Producers v. EPA* before the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit, which vacated the rule and described EPA's defense as "lipstick on a pig," and defeating a \$10 billion annual electric-vehicle subsidy in *Iowa v. Wright* before the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit.

Mr. Conde's commentary has been published and referenced in the *Wall Street Journal*, the *Washington Examiner*, *Concurrences* (an antitrust publication), the *Yale Notice & Comment* Blog, and *Newsweek*, among others. Along with his partner Michael Buschbacher, Mr. Conde's op-ed in the *Wall Street Journal* developed the legal strategy that explained how the EPA and Congress could use the Congressional Review Act to repeal the Biden administration's approval of state electric-vehicle mandates, a strategy successfully adopted by the Trump administration and Congress.

Mr. Conde began his legal career as an associate with Boyden Gray PLLC. Before re-joining the firm, he clerked for Judge Douglas H. Ginsburg in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit and Judge David J. Porter in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit. Mr. Conde holds a J.D., *cum laude*, from George Mason University's Antonin Scalia Law School, and a B.A. in Political Theory and Philosophy from the Catholic University of America.
