

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 885
OFFERED BY MR. BISHOP OF UTAH

Page 1, beginning on line 7, strike section 2 and redesignate section 3 as section 2.

Page 3, beginning on line 1, amend section 2 (as redesignated) to read as follows:

1 SEC. 2. BOUNDARY EXPANSION.

2 Section 201(a) of Public Law 95–629 (16 U.S.C.
3 410ee(a)) is amended—

4 (1) by striking “In order” and inserting “(1) In
5 order”;

6 (2) by striking “The park shall also” and in-
7 serting “(2) The park shall also”;

8 (3) by striking “After advising the” and insert-
9 ing “(5) After advising the”; and

10 (4) by inserting after paragraph (2) (as so des-
11 ignated by paragraph (2)) the following:

12 “(3) The boundary of the park is further modi-
13 fied to include approximately 137 acres, as depicted
14 on the map titled ‘San Antonio Missions National
15 Historical Park Proposed Boundary Addition’, num-
16 bered 472/113,006A, and dated June 2012. The

1 map shall be on file and available for inspection in
2 the appropriate offices of the National Park Service,
3 U.S. Department of the Interior.

4 “(4) The Secretary may not acquire by con-
5 demnation any land or interest in land within the
6 boundaries of the park. The Secretary is authorized
7 to acquire land and interests in land that are within
8 the boundaries of the park pursuant to paragraph
9 (3) by donation or exchange only (and in the case
10 of an exchange, no payment may be made by the
11 Secretary to any landowner). No private property or
12 non-Federal public property shall be included within
13 the boundaries of the park without the written con-
14 sent of the owner of such property. Nothing in this
15 Act, the establishment of the park, or the manage-
16 ment plan of the park shall be construed to create
17 buffer zones outside of the park. That an activity or
18 use can be seen or heard from within the park shall
19 not preclude the conduct of that activity or use out-
20 side the park.”.

Amend the title so as to read: “~~A Bill~~⁹ to expand the
boundary of the San Antonio Missions National Histor-
ical Park, and for other purposes.”. ✓
