COMMITTEE MARKUP ACTION

The Committee on Natural Resources met in open session on Wednesday, April 11, 2018, to consider the following bills:

H.R. 3144 (Rep. Cathy McMorris Rodgers), To provide for operations of the Federal Columbia River Power System pursuant to a certain operation plan for a specified period of time, and for other purposes.

The Subcommittee on Water, Power and Oceans was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3144 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Grijalva [003], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 17 yeas and 23 nays.

H.R. 3144 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 23 yeas and 17 nays.

H.R. 3392 (Rep. Mike Johnson), To provide for stability of title to certain land in the State of Louisiana, and for other purposes. "Lake Bistineau Land Title Stability Act".

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3392 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Johnson of Louisiana [#1], was agreed to by voice vote.

H.R. 3392, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by voice vote.

H.R. 3997 (Rep. Keith J. Rothfus), To waive the application fee for any special use permit for veterans demonstrations and special events at war memorials on Federal land, and for other purposes. "Free Veterans from Fees Act".

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3997 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah [#1], was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 3997, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 4257 (Rep. Chris Stewart), To maximize land management efficiencies, promote land conservation, generate education funding, and for other purposes. "Advancing Conservation and Education Act".

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 4257 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah [#1], was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 4257, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 5005 (Rep. Al Lawson, Jr.), To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study to determine the suitability and feasibility of establishing the birthplace of James Weldon Johnson in Jacksonville, Florida, as a unit of the National Park System.

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 5005 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 5005 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.
