COMMITTEE MARKUP ACTION

The Committee on Natural Resources met in open session on Wednesday, April 18, 2018, to consider the following bills:

H.R. 788 (Rep. Duncan Hunter), To amend the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act to facilitate the establishment of additional or expanded public target ranges in certain States. "Target Practice and Marksmanship Training Support Act".

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 788 by unanimous consent.

Amendments offered en bloc by Ms. Bordallo [001], [002], [003] and [004] were offered and withdrawn.

H.R. 788 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by voice vote.

H.R. 1026 (Rep. Richard M. Nolan), To revise the authorized route of the North Country National Scenic Trail in northeastern Minnesota and to extend the trail into Vermont to connect with the Appalachian National Scenic Trail, and for other purposes. "North Country National Scenic Trail Route Adjustment Act".

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1026 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah [#1], was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1026, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1037 (Rep. Stephen F. Lynch), To authorize the National Emergency Medical Services Memorial Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes.

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1037 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah [#1], was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1037, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2991 (Rep. Lloyd Smucker), To establish the Susquehanna National Heritage Area in the State of Pennsylvania, and for other purposes. *"Susquehanna National Heritage Area Act"*.

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2991 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah [#1], was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 2991, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 3400, (Rep. Rob Bishop), To promote innovative approaches to outdoor recreation on Federal land and to open up opportunities for collaboration with non-Federal partners, and for other purposes. "Recreation Not Red-Tape Act";

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3400 by unanimous consent.

An amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) was offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah [051].

An amendment to the ANS offered by Ms. Bordallo [047], was agreed to by voice vote.

An amendment to the ANS offered by Ms. Cheney [060], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 9 yeas and 27 nays.

An amendment to the ANS offered by Mr. McClintock [#2], was agreed to by voice vote.

The amendment in the nature of a substitute, as amended, was agreed to by voice vote.

H.R. 3400, as amended, was adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by voice vote.

H.R. 4069 (Rep. Don Young), To amend the Migratory Bird Treaty Act to clarify the treatment of authentic Alaska Native articles of handicraft containing nonedible migratory bird parts, and for other purposes.

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 4069 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 4069 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 4645 (Rep. Greg Gianforte), To amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to designate certain segments of East Rosebud Creek in Carbon County, Montana, as components of the Wild and Scenic Rivers System. "East Rosebud Wild and Scenic Rivers Act".

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 4645 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 4645 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.
