

COMMITTEE MARKUP ACTION

The Committee on Natural Resources met in open session on Wednesday, September 26, 2018, to consider the following bills:

H.R. 4644 (Rep. Greg Gianforte), To withdraw certain National Forest System land in the Emigrant Crevice area located in the Custer Gallatin National Forest, Park County, Montana, from the mining and mineral leasing laws of the United States, and for other purposes. *“Yellowstone Gateway Protection Act”*.

The Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 4644 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Gosar [132], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 10 yeas and 21 nays.

An amendment offered by Mr. Gosar [133], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 10 yeas and 22 nays.

An amendment offered by Mr. Gosar [135], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 9 yeas and 23 nays.

An amendment offered by Mr. Gosar [136], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 11 yeas and 21 nays.

An amendment offered by Mr. Gosar [137], fell on a point of order.

An amendment offered by Mr. Gosar [139], fell on a point of order.

H.R. 4644 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 28 yeas and 4 nays.

H.R. 5636 (Rep. J. French Hill), To designate additions to the Flatside Wilderness on the Ouachita National Forest, and for other purposes. *“Flatside Wilderness Enhancement Act”*.

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 5636 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Westerman [#1], was agreed to by unanimous consent.

H.R. 5636, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 5706 (Rep. Colleen Hanabusa), To establish the Pearl Harbor National Memorial in the State of Hawai'i and the Honouliuli National Historic Site in the State of Hawai'i, and for other purposes. "*World War II Pacific Sites Establishment Act*".

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 5706 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 5706 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 5727 (Rep. John R. Curtis), To establish the San Rafael Swell Western Heritage and Historic Mining National Conservation Area in the State of Utah, to designate wilderness areas in the State, to provide for certain land conveyances, and for other purposes. "*Emery County Public Land Management Act of 2018*".

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 5727 by unanimous consent.

An amendment in the nature of a substitute [ANS] offered by Mr. Curtis [025], was offered.

An amendment to the ANS offered by Mr. Gosar [140], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 11 yeas and 27 nays.

An amendment to the ANS offered by Mr. Gosar [273], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 16 yeas and 22 nays.

An amendment to the ANS offered by Mr. Gosar [274], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 8 yeas and 30 nays.

An amendment to the ANS offered by Mr. Lowenthal [058], was not agreed to by voice vote.

An amendment to the ANS offered by Mr. Bishop of UT [011], was agreed to by voice vote.

An amendment to the ANS offered by Ms. Hanabusa [056], was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 17 yeas and 21 nays.

The ANS offered by Mr. Curtis [025], as amended, was agreed to by a roll call vote of 21 yeas and 17 nays.

H.R. 5727, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by voice vote.

H.R. 6064 (Rep. Thomas R. Suozzi), To rename the Oyster Bay National Wildlife Refuge as the Congressman Lester Wolff National Wildlife Refuge.

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6064 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 6064 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 6118 (Rep. David Rouzer), To direct the Secretary of the Interior to annually designate at least one city in the United States as an "American World War II Heritage City", and for other purposes.

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6118 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 6118 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 6255 (Rep. Darren Soto), To amend title 18, United States Code, to establish measures to combat invasive lionfish, and for other purposes.

The Subcommittee on Water, Power and Oceans was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6255 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 6255 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 6666 (Rep. Daniel M. Donovan, Jr.), To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to grant to States and local governments easements and rights-of-way over Federal land within Gateway National Recreation Area for construction, operation, and maintenance of projects for control and prevention of flooding and shoreline erosion.

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6666 by unanimous consent.

H.R. 6666 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 6682 (Rep. Scott R. Tipton), To amend the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 to improve the transparency and oversight of land conveyances involving disposal or acquisition of National Forest System lands or Bureau of Land Management public lands, to

provide protections and certainty for private landowners related to resurveying such public lands, and for other purposes. *“Protection and Transparency for Adjacent Landowners Act”*.

The Subcommittee on Federal Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6682 by unanimous consent.

An amendment offered by Mr. Tipton [#1], was agreed to by voice vote.

H.R. 6682, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by voice vote.

H.R. 6784 (Rep. Sean P. Duffy), To provide for removal of the gray wolf in the contiguous 48 States from the List of Endangered and Threatened Wildlife published under the Endangered Species Act of 1973. *“Manage our Wolves Act”*.

H.R. 6784 was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 19 yeas and 15 nays.
