Questions from Rep. Debbie Dingell for Scott Cameron, Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary in the Office of the Assistant Secretary - Policy, Management, and Budget

- Mr. Cameron, in February, Congress passed S. 47, the John D. Dingell, Jr. Conservation, Management, and Recreation Act, which was the most comprehensive public lands legislation in a decade. A major provision of that bill—one that helped it cross the finish line—was permanent authorization of the Land and Water Conservation Fund. The program routinely receives broad, bipartisan support; yet, DOI's FY 20 budget requests Congress reduce funding for this program by three quarters and would allocate almost nothing to Federal acquisitions.
 - 1. Do you believe this request conforms with the sense of a Congress that just permanently authorized LWCF as part of a package with a 363-62 voting margin, and a 92-8 margin in the Senate?
 - 2. How does the agency justify trying to eliminate a program so widely supported by the American people?
- Mr. Cameron, this administration claims to support hunters, anglers, and outdoor recreation enthusiasts, but I notice that your budget includes a 50 percent reduction in the amount of funds for recreation access acquisitions. That means less money towards helping outdoor recreationists access and enjoy our public lands.
 - 3. How can this administration claim to support public land users when it doesn't want to use money to help American's access their lands?
