

Committee on Natural Resources – Markup Action

The Committee on Natural Resources met on Wednesday, January 29, 2020, to consider the following bills. Per Committee Rule 9(f)(1), amendments and roll call votes will be posted no later than 24 hours after the vote is taken. These documents can be found at docs.house.gov, found [here](#).

[H.R. 1049](#), To authorize a National Heritage Area Program, and for other purposes. “*National Heritage Area Act of 2019.*”

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1049 by unanimous consent.

- Representative Paul Tonko (D-NY) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute.
- Ranking Member Rob Bishop (R-UT) offered amendments designated Bishop #1 and Bishop #3 *en bloc* to the amendment in the nature of a substitute by unanimous consent. The *en bloc* amendments were agreed to by voice vote.
- Ranking Member Bishop offered an amendment designated Bishop #2 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was withdrawn.
- The amendment in the nature of a substitute offered by Representative Tonko, as amended, was agreed to by voice vote.
- The bill, as amended, was ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by voice vote.

[H.R. 1240](#), To preserve United States fishing heritage through a national program dedicated to training and assisting the next generation of commercial fishermen. “*Young Fishermen's Development Act of 2019.*”

Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1240 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Raúl M. Grijalva (D-AZ) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute.
- The amendment in the nature of a substitute offered by Chair Grijalva was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

[H.R. 2748](#), To establish an integrated national approach to respond to ongoing and expected effects of extreme weather and climate change by protecting, managing, and conserving the fish, wildlife, and plants of the United States, and to maximize Government efficiency and reduce costs, in cooperation with State, local, and Tribal Governments and other entities, and for other purposes. “*Safeguarding America's Future and Environment Act.*”

Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources, the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States, the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands, and the

Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2748 by unanimous consent.

- Representative Matt Cartwright (D-PA) offered an amendment designated Cartwright #1. The amendment was agreed to by voice vote.
- The bill, as amended, was ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 22 yeas and 15 nays.

[H.R. 2795](#), To establish National Wildlife Corridors to provide for the protection and restoration of certain native fish, wildlife, and plant species, and for other purposes. “*Wildlife Corridors Conservation Act of 2019.*”

Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States, the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands, and the Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2795 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Raúl M. Grijalva (D-AZ) offered an amendment designated Grijalva #111. The amendment was agreed to by voice vote.
- Ranking Member Rob Bishop (R-UT) offered an amendment designated Bishop #1. The amendment was withdrawn.
- The bill, as amended, was ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 22 yeas and 15 nays.

[H.R. 2956](#), To provide for the establishment of the Western Riverside County Wildlife Refuge.

Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2956 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Raúl M. Grijalva (D-AZ) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute.
- The amendment in the nature of a substitute offered by Chair Grijalva was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

[H.R. 3399](#), To amend the Nutria Eradication and Control Act of 2003 to include California in the program, and for other purposes.

Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3399 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Raúl M. Grijalva (D-AZ) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment in the nature of a substitute was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

[H.R. 4348](#), To terminate certain rules issued by the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Commerce relating to endangered and threatened species, and for other purposes. “*Protect America's Wildlife and Fish In Need of Conservation Act of 2019*” or the “*PAW and FIN Conservation Act of 2019*”

Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 4348 by unanimous consent.

- Representative Paul A. Gosar (R-AZ) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute designated #195. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 15 yeas and 22 nays.
- The bill was ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 21 yeas and 16 nays.

[H.R. 4679](#), To require the Comptroller General of the United States to submit to Congress a report examining efforts by the Regional Fishery Management Councils, the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission, and the National Marine Fisheries Service to prepare and adapt United States fishery management for the impacts of climate change, and for other purposes. “*Climate-Ready Fisheries Act of 2019.*”

Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 4679 by unanimous consent.

- The bill was ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 22 yeas and 15 nays.

[H.R. 5179](#), To require the Secretary of the Interior to establish Tribal Wildlife Corridors, and for other purposes. “*Tribal Wildlife Corridors Act of 2019.*”

Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States, and the Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 5179 by unanimous consent.

- The bill was ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 22 yeas and 15 nays.
