It is minutes past midnight here in the Marianas, so, good morning.

I want to begin by thanking our witnesses —

Marianas Governor Torres, welcome Governor —

and the Governors from our other U.S. insular areas —

thank you all for joining us today for this oversight hearing
on President Biden's "Build Back Better" plan.

That plan is still under construction, which is why I am holding today's hearing.

We know the plan will include a giant infrastructure package.

We also know how easy it can be for the needs of the insular areas to be overlooked, when major legislation like this is enacted.

Look how we were left out of Obamacare.

But our track record improved considerably with enactment this month of the American Rescue Plan.
All of our areas are receiving substantial assistance. So, let us build on that momentum.

Let us build the case for the infrastructure we need in the insular areas.

I hope today's hearing will, also, make the case for a bipartisan approach to Build Back Better.

We have Governors of both parties, who may not always agree on policy.

But one area I think you will all agree is that the quality of life for our people and the economic success of our islands is closely tied to having first-rate infrastructure.

We want you, Governors, to have this opportunity to inform Congress and the Administration of the infrastructure and other needs in each of your jurisdictions that you want included in the Build Back Better plan.

You have direct, on-the-ground, managerial understanding of the needs of your islands.

And we need to hear your ideas.

Of course, we all know the broad outlines of what is needed:

- Our only hospital in the Marianas is almost 40 years old, in need of modernization.
- We need modern health clinics on the islands of Rota and Tinian.
- Families cannot drink the water the comes out of the tap.
- We are pumping treated sewage into the same water we fish in and offer to tourists for vacations.
- Our electrical systems are old, expensive, and fossil-fuel based.

And, when typhoons strike, exposed power lines on wooden poles are ripped down by the winds.

Our public utility corporation estimates modernization will cost over \$800 million, I understand, a daunting sum.

So, we need to hear your vision today, Governors, and in the coming weeks for what your most important needs are.

And you, of course, need a commitment of funding from the Biden administration and from this Congress, so our areas of America can have an American quality of infrastructure.

Lastly, I think, we all need to make a commitment — the federal government and the insular governments — to build back better to standards that are sustainable and environmentally sound.

Because no areas know better than our insular areas that the climate is changing.

And our islands will be dealing with repeated and powerful typhoons and hurricanes, sea level rise, and the deterioration of the coral reefs that protect our shores.

We are going to have to design and build with that new reality in mind.

Hopefully, by doing so, we will save the repeated costs of billions of dollars for disaster recovery Congress has had to provide.

And we will also be sparing the individuals and families and communities we represent some of the trauma and painfully long periods of recovery that we are even now experiencing.

So, again, I know you are all grateful for the much-needed financial relief Congress and President Biden have provided in the American Rescue Plan.

Governor Torres, you have already announced you will be using that money to put furloughed workers back on salary.

And the Biden administration has also approved several Marianas EDA grant applications that the previous administration sat on.

The Biden administration also announced Monday that you were getting the waiver of local match for Lost Wages Assistance, Governor Torres.

Another of your requests the previous administration ignored.

But despite all of this good news our work is just begun.

Now it is time to build back better.
