

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 2497**

**OFFERED BY MR. NEGUSE OF COLORADO**

Page 1, line 8, strike “(1)” and insert “(2)”.

Page 1, before line 8, insert the following:

1           (1) MAP.—The term “Map” means the map en-  
2           titled “Amache National Historical Site Proposed  
3           Boundary”, numbered 100/175348 and dated July  
4           2021.

Page 2, line 1, strike “(2)” and insert “(3)”.

Page 2, beginning on line 2, strike “, acting through  
the Director of the National Park Service”.

Page 2, line 5, strike “There” insert “Subject to  
subsection (c), there”.

Page 2, strike line 24 and all that follows through  
page 3, line 25 and insert the following:

5           (c) DETERMINATION BY THE SECRETARY.—The Na-  
6           tional Historic Site shall not be established until the date  
7           on which the Secretary determines that a sufficient quan-  
8           tity of land or interests in land has been acquired to con-  
9           stitute a manageable park unit.

1 (d) NOTICE.—Not later than 30 days after the Sec-  
2 retary makes a determination under subsection (c), the  
3 Secretary shall publish in the Federal Register notice of  
4 the establishment of the National Historic Site.

5 (e) BOUNDARY; MAP.—

6 (1) BOUNDARY.—The boundary of the National  
7 Historic Site shall be as generally depicted on the  
8 Map.

9 (2) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The Map shall be  
10 on file and available for public inspection in the ap-  
11 propriate offices of the National Park Service.

12 (f) LAND ACQUISITION AUTHORITY.—The Secretary  
13 may acquire any land or interests in land located within  
14 the boundary of the Camp Amache National Historic  
15 Landmark, as generally depicted on the Map, by exterior  
16 boundary of the National Historic Site by—

17 (1) donation;

18 (2) purchase from a willing seller with donated  
19 or appropriated Funds; or

20 (3) exchange.

21 (g) ADDITION TO BOUNDARY.—Any lands or inter-  
22 ests in land acquired under paragraph (1) shall be in-  
23 cluded within the boundary of the National Historic Site.

Page 4, line 1, strike “(f)” and insert “(h)”.

Page 4, strike line 15 through 25.

Page 5, line 1, strike “(C)” and insert “(B)”.

Page 5, line 9, strike “(g)” and insert “(i)”.

Page 5, beginning on line 13, strike “exterior boundaries” and insert “boundary”.

Page 5, line 14, strike “site” and insert “National Historic Site”.

Page 5, line 15, strike “(h)” and insert “(j)”.

Page 5, line 19, strike “exterior”.

Page 5, line 19, strike “site” and insert “National Historic Site”.

Page 5, strike lines 23 through 24 and insert the following:

1       (k) EFFECT ON WATER RIGHTS.—Except as pro-  
2       vided for in subsection (l), nothing in this Act shall af-  
3       fect—

At the end of the bill, insert the following:

4       (l) OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF WATER IN-  
5       FRASTRUCTURE AND APPURTENANCES.—

6               (1) The town of Granada, Colorado, shall main-  
7       tain responsibility for the operation and maintenance  
8       of all water infrastructure, systems and appur-  
9       tenances located within the boundary of the National

1 Historic Site in existence on the date of enactment  
2 of this Act, including but not limited to wells,  
3 pumps, tanks, water lines, valves, and water treat-  
4 ment facilities.

5 (2) The Secretary shall provide the town of  
6 Granada, Colorado, with access to those areas of the  
7 National Historic Site determined as necessary for  
8 the operation and maintenance of water infrastruc-  
9 ture and appurtenances.

10 (3) The Secretary may permit the city of Gra-  
11 nada, Colorado, to construct or install new water in-  
12 frastructure, systems and appurtenances consistent  
13 with applicable laws, limited only to those areas de-  
14 termined in subsection (i)(2), and in a manner that  
15 ensures the preservation, protection, and proper  
16 management of the National Historic Site.

17 (4) At such time that all water infrastructure,  
18 systems and appurtenances located within the  
19 boundary of the National Historic Site are no longer  
20 utilized by the city of Granada, Colorado, associated  
21 improvements and associated water rights may be  
22 acquired through donation to and made part of the  
23 National Historic Site in a condition satisfactory to  
24 the Secretary.

Amend the title so as to read: “A bill to establish the Amache National Historic Site in the State of Colorado as a Unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.”.
