## **Committee on Natural Resources – Markup Action Report**

The Committee on Natural Resources met on Wednesday, July 13, 2022, to consider the following measures. Per Committee Rule 9(f)(1), roll call votes will be posted no later than 48 hours after the vote is taken. These documents and the amendments below can be found at docs.house.gov, found <u>here</u>.

<u>H.R. 2794</u> (Rep. Betty McCollum), To provide for the protection of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness and interconnected Federal lands and waters, including Voyageurs National Park, within the Rainy River Watershed in the State of Minnesota, and for other purposes. *Boundary Waters Wilderness Protection and Pollution Prevention Act.* 

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands and the Subcommittee on Energy and Minerals Resources were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2794 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Raúl M. Grijalva (D-AZ) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute.
- Rep. Pete Stauber (R-MN) offered an amendment designated Stauber #1 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 20 yeas and 21 nays.
- Rep. Stauber offered an amendment designated Stauber #2 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 19 yeas and 23 nays.
- Rep. Stauber offered an amendment designated Stauber #3 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 18 yeas and 23 nays.
- Rep. Stauber offered an amendment designated Stauber #4 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 18 yeas and 22 nays.<sup>1</sup>
- Rep. Stauber offered an amendment designated Stauber #12 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 19 yeas and 22 nays.
- Rep. Stauber offered an amendment designated Stauber #9 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 17 yeas and 22 nays.
- By unanimous consent, Rep. Stauber offered amendments designated Stauber #5, Stauber #8, Stauber #10, Stauber #11, Stauber #13, Stauber #14, Stauber #15, and Stauber #20 en bloc to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The en bloc amendments were not agreed to by a roll call vote of 18 yeas and 22 nays.
- Ranking Member Bruce Westerman (R-AR) offered an amendment designated Westerman #17 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 18 yeas and 23 nays.

- Rep. Lauren Boebert (R-CO) offered an amendment designated Boebert #16 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 17 yeas and 23 nays.
- Rep. Tom Tiffany (R-WI) offered an amendment designated Tiffany #6 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 16 yeas and 23 nays.
- By unanimous consent, Rep. Garret Graves (R-LA) offered amendments designated Graves #1 (Revised) and Graves #4 en bloc to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The en bloc amendments were not agreed to by voice vote.
- By unanimous consent, Rep. Graves offered amendments designated Graves #3 and Graves #5 en bloc to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The en bloc amendments were not agreed to by a roll call vote of 17 yeas and 23 nays.
- The amendment in the nature of a substitute was agreed to by voice vote.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 24 yeas and 16 nays.

<u>H.R. 3686</u> (Rep. Ann M. Kuster), To amend the Omnibus Parks and Public Lands Management Act of 1996 to provide for the establishment of a Ski Area Fee Retention Account, and for other purposes. *SHRED Act* or *Ski Hill Resources for Economic Development Act*.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3686 by unanimous consent.

- Rep. Joe Neguse (D-CO) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute.
- Ranking Member Westerman offered an amendment designated Westerman #1 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- Ranking Member Westerman offered an amendment designated Westerman #2 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The amendment in the nature of a substitute, as amended, was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 5715</u> (Rep. Raúl M. Grijalva), To reauthorize the Morris K. Udall and Stewart L. Udall Trust Fund, and for other purposes.

- Chair Grijalva offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute.
- Rep. Jay Obernolte (R-CA) offered an amendment designated Obernolte #1 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was agreed to by voice vote.
- The amendment in the nature of a substitute, as amended, was agreed to by voice vote.

• The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by voice vote.

<u>H.R. 6364</u> (Rep. Matt Cartwright), To amend the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area Improvement Act to extend the exception to the closure of certain roads within the Recreation Area for local businesses, and for other purposes.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6364 by unanimous consent.

• The bill was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 6442</u> (Rep. Russ Fulcher), To amend section 101703 of title 54, United States Code, to include Tribal Governments and quasi-governmental entities, and for other purposes. *PACTS Act* or *Partnership Agreements Creating Tangible Savings Act*.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forest, and Public Lands and the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6442 by unanimous consent.

- Rep. Russ Fulcher (R-ID) offered an amendment designated Fulcher #1. The amendment was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 6654</u> (Rep. Raúl M. Grijalva), To direct the Secretary of the Interior to establish a National Climate Adaptation Science Center and Regional Climate Adaptation Science Centers to respond to the effects of extreme weather events and climate trends, and for other purposes. *CASC Act* or *Climate Adaptation Science Centers Act*.

Subcommittee on Energy and Minerals Resources and the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6654 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Grijalva offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute.
- Rep. Blake D. Moore (R-UT) offered an amendment designated Moore #2 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 17 yeas and 22 nays.
- Rep. Moore offered an amendment designated Moore #3 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 17 yeas and 21 nays.
- Ranking Member Westerman offered an amendment designated Westerman #1 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by voice vote.

- Rep. Boebert offered an amendment designated Boebert #338 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 16 yeas and 20 nays.
- Rep. Tiffany offered an amendment designated Tiffany #4 to the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment was not agreed to by a roll call vote of 17 yeas and 21 nays.
- The amendment in the nature of a substitute was agreed to by voice vote.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by a roll call vote of 22 yeas and 18 nays.

H.R. 6936 (Rep. Elise Stefanik), To provide for the issuance of a semipostal to benefit programs that combat invasive species. *Stamp Out Invasive Species Act.* 

Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6936 by unanimous consent.

• The bill was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 7283 (Rep. Matt Cartwright), To amend the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act to make certain activities eligible for grants from the Abandoned Mine Reclamation Fund, and for other purposes. *STREAM Act* or *Safeguarding Treatment for the Restoration of Ecosystems from Abandoned Mines Act*.

Subcommittee on Energy and Minerals Resources was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 7283 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Grijalva offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute.
- The amendment in the nature of a substitute was agreed to by voice vote.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by voice vote.

<u>H.R. 7496</u> (Rep. Stacey E. Plaskett), To direct the Secretary of the Interior to install a plaque at the peak of Ram Head in the Virgin Islands National Park on St. John, United States Virgin Islands, to commemorate the slave rebellion that began on St. John in 1733.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 7496 by unanimous consent.

• The bill was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 7693</u> (Rep. Bruce Westerman), To amend title 54, United States Code, to reauthorize the National Park Foundation. *National Park Foundation Reauthorization Act of 2022*.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 7693 by unanimous consent.

• The bill was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.
