Committee on Natural Resources – Markup Action Report

The Committee on Natural Resources met on Thursday, December 8, 2022, to consider the following measures. These documents and the amendments below can be found at docs.house.gov, found here.

<u>H.R. 3681</u> (Rep. Darren Soto), To direct the Director of the United States Geological Survey to establish a program to map zones that are at greater risk of sinkhole formation, and for other purposes. *Sinkhole Mapping Act of 2021*.

Subcommittee for Energy and Minerals Resources was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3681 by unanimous consent.

• The bill was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 5522 (Rep. Ron Kind), To require the Secretary of the Interior to develop and maintain a cadastre of Federal real property. *Federal Land Asset Inventory Reform Act of 2021*.

Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources and the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 5522 by unanimous consent.

• The bill was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 6032</u> (Rep. Jared Huffman), To take certain Federal lands located in Siskiyou County, California, and Humboldt County, California, into trust for the benefit of the Karuk Tribe, and for other purposes. *Katimiîn and Ameekyáaraam Sacred Lands Act*.

Subcommittee for Indigenous People of the United States and the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6032 by unanimous consent.

- Rep. Jared Huffman (D-CA) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment in the nature of a substitute was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 6427</u> (Rep. Mike Johnson), To amend the Red River National Wildlife Refuge Act to modify the boundary of the Red River National Wildlife Refuge, and for other purposes. *Red River National Wildlife Refuge Boundary Modification Act*.

Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6427 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Raúl M. Grijalva (D-AZ) offered an amendment designated Grijalva amendment #1. The amendment was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 6611</u> (Rep. William R. Keating), To authorize the Embassy of France in Washington, DC, to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs to honor the extraordinary contributions of Jean Monnet to restoring peace between European nations and establishing the European Union, and for other purposes.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6611 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Grijalva offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment in the nature of a substitute was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 6720</u> (Rep. Jamie Raskin), To authorize the Thomas Paine Memorial Association to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6720 by unanimous consent.

• The bill was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 6964</u> (Rep. Marilyn Strickland), To authorize leases of up to 99 years for lands held in trust for the Confederated Tribes of the Chehalis Reservation.

Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 6964 by unanimous consent.

• The bill was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 7615</u> (Rep. Blake D. Moore), To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to enter into partnerships to develop housing, and for other purposes. *LODGE Act* or *Lodging Options Developed for Government Employees Act*.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 7615 by unanimous consent.

• Rep. Blake Moore (R-UT) offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment in the nature of a substitute was agreed to by unanimous consent.

• The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 7918</u> (Rep. William R. Keating), To require the Secretary of Commerce to establish the Sea Turtle Rescue Assistance Grant Program. *Sea Turtle Rescue Assistance Act of 2022*.

Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 7918 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Grijalva offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment in the nature of a substitute was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 7952</u> (Rep. Madeline Dean), To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to issue a right-of-way permit with respect to a natural gas distribution pipeline within Valley Forge National Historical Park, and for other purposes. *Valley Forge Park Realignment Permit and Promise Act*.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 7952 by unanimous consent.

- Chair Grijalva offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute. The amendment in the nature of a substitute was agreed to by unanimous consent.
- The bill, as amended, was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>H.R. 8115</u> (Rep. Doug LaMalfa), To amend the Recreation and Public Purposes Act to authorize sales and leases of certain Federal land to federally recognized Indian Tribes, and for other purposes. *Recreation and Public Purposes Tribal Parity Act*.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands and the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States were discharged from further consideration of H.R. 8115 by unanimous consent.

• The bill was adopted and ordered favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

<u>S.314</u> (Sen. Jeff Merkley), A bill to repeal the Klamath Tribe Judgment Fund Act. *Klamath Tribe Judgment Fund Repeal Act*.

Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States was discharged from further consideration of S. 314 by unanimous consent.
