

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
TO H.R. 5665
OFFERED BY MS. Stansbury

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Promoting Accessi-
3 bility on Federal Lands Act of 2024”.

4 **SEC. 2. ACCESSIBLE RECREATION INVENTORY.**

5 (a) ASSESSMENT.—Not later than 5 years after the
6 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary concerned
7 shall—

8 (1) carry out a comprehensive assessment of
9 outdoor recreation facilities on Federal recreational
10 lands and waters under the jurisdiction of the re-
11 spective Secretary concerned to determine the acces-
12 sibility of such outdoor recreation facilities, con-
13 sistent with the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968
14 (42 U.S.C. 4151 et seq.) and section 504 of the Re-
15 habilitation Act (29 U.S.C. 794), including—

16 (A) camp shelters, camping facilities, and
17 camping units;

18 (B) boat launch ramps;

1 (C) hunting, fishing, shooting, or archery
2 ranges or locations;

3 (D) outdoor constructed features;

4 (E) picnic facilities and picnic units; and

5 (F) any other outdoor recreation facilities,
6 as determined by the Secretary concerned; and

7 (2) make information about such opportunities
8 available (including through the use of prominently
9 displayed links) on public websites of—

10 (A) each of the Federal land management
11 agencies; and

12 (B) each relevant unit and subunit of the
13 Federal land management agencies.

14 (b) INCLUSION OF CURRENT ASSESSMENTS.—As
15 part of the comprehensive assessment required under sub-
16 section (a)(1), to the extent practicable, the Secretary con-
17 cerned may rely on assessments completed or data gath-
18 ered prior to the date of the enactment of this Act.

19 (c) PUBLIC INFORMATION.—Not later than 7 years
20 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
21 concerned shall identify opportunities to create, update, or
22 replace signage and other publicly available information,
23 including web page information, related to accessibility
24 and consistent with the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968
25 (42 U.S.C. 4151 et seq.) and section 504 of the Rehabili-

1 tation Act (29 U.S.C. 794) at outdoor recreation facilities
2 covered by the assessment required under subsection
3 (a)(1).

4 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

5 (1) FEDERAL LAND MANAGEMENT AGENCY.—

6 The term “Federal land management agency” has
7 the meaning give the term in in section 802 of the
8 Federal Lands Recreation Enhancement Act (16
9 U.S.C. 6801).

10 (2) SECRETARY CONCERNED.—The term “Sec-
11 retary concerned” means—

12 (A) the Secretary of the Interior, with re-
13 spect to land under the jurisdiction of the Sec-
14 retary; or

15 (B) the Secretary of Agriculture, with re-
16 spect to land managed by the Forest Service.
