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## A BILL

To require the Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Communications and Information to report to Congress on any barriers to establishing online portals to accept, process, and dispose of certain Form 299s, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Facilitating the De-  
5       ployment of Infrastructure with Greater Internet Trans-

1 actions And Legacy Applications Act” or the “Facilitating  
2 DIGITAL Applications Act”.

3 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON BARRIERS TO ESTABLISHING ONLINE**  
4 **PORTALS TO ACCEPT, PROCESS, AND DIS-**  
5 **POSE OF CERTAIN FORM 299s.**

6 (a) REPORT.—

7 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after  
8 the date of the enactment of this section, and every  
9 60 days thereafter until the Secretaries concerned  
10 each notify the Assistant Secretary under paragraph  
11 (2), the Assistant Secretary shall submit to the ap-  
12 propriate congressional committees a report that de-  
13 scribes—

14 (A) whether the Secretaries concerned have  
15 established, with respect to the relevant covered  
16 department, an online portal for the acceptance,  
17 processing, and disposal of a Form 299 for  
18 communications use authorization; and

19 (B) any barrier to the establishment of any  
20 such portal.

21 (2) NOTIFICATION.—Not later than 3 business  
22 days after the date on which the online portal has  
23 been established by a Secretary pursuant to para-  
24 graph (1), that Secretary shall notify the Assistant  
25 Secretary of the establishment of such portal.

1                   (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:

2                   (1) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMIT-  
3                   TEES.—The term “appropriate congressional com-  
4                   mittees” means—  
5                         (A) the Committee on Energy and Com-  
6                         merce of the House of Representatives;  
7                         (B) the Committee on Natural Resources  
8                         of the House of Representatives;  
9                         (C) the Committee on Commerce, Science,  
10                         and Transportation of the Senate; and  
11                         (D) the Committee on Environment and  
12                         Public Works of the Senate.

13                   (2) ASSISTANT SECRETARY.—The term “Assist-  
14                         ant Secretary” means the Assistant Secretary of  
15                         Commerce for Communications and Information.

16                   (3) COMMUNICATIONS FACILITY.—The term  
17                         “communications facility” has the meaning given the  
18                         term “communications facility installation” in sec-  
19                         tion 6409(d) of the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job  
20                         Creation Act of 2012 (47 U.S.C. 1455(d)).

21                   (4) COMMUNICATIONS USE.—The term “com-  
22                         munications use” means the placement and oper-  
23                         ation of a communications facility.

24                   (5) COMMUNICATIONS USE AUTHORIZATION.—  
25                         The term “communications use authorization”

1 means an easement, right-of-way, lease, license, or  
2 other authorization—

3 (A) provided by the Secretary of the Interior or the Secretary of Agriculture;

5 (B) to locate or modify a communications facility on covered land; and

7 (C) for the primary purpose of authorizing  
8 the occupancy and use of such covered land for  
9 communications use.

10 (6) COVERED LAND.—The term “covered land”  
11 means—

12 (A) public lands; and

13 (B) National Forest System land.

14 (7) FORM 299.—The term “Form 299” means  
15 the form established under section 6409(b)(2)(A) of  
16 the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act  
17 of 2012 (47 U.S.C. 1455(b)(2)(A)), or any successor  
18 form.

19 (8) NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM.—The term  
20 “National Forest System” has the meaning given  
21 that term in section 11(a) of the Forest and Range-  
22 land Renewable Resources Planning Act of 1974 (16  
23 U.S.C. 1609(a)).

24 (9) RELEVANT COVERED DEPARTMENT.—The  
25 term “relevant covered department” means—

1                             (A) with respect to the Secretary of the In-  
2                             terior, the Department of the Interior; and

3                             (B) with respect to the Secretary of Agri-  
4                             culture, the Department of Agriculture.

5                             (10) SECRETARY CONCERNED.—The term  
6                             “Secretary concerned” means—

7                             (A) the Secretary of the Interior; and  
8                             (B) the Secretary of Agriculture, acting  
9                             through the Chief of the Forest Service.
